Title II-A funds are used to enhance and expand knowledge and teaching skills for teachers of core academic subjects and to enhance and expand a principal's leadership knowledge and skills. Title II-A provides funds for training, retention, and recruitment of teachers and principals, with emphasis on ensuring that teachers of core academic subjects have appropriate certification and deliver effective instruction, especially at low poverty schools. Title II-A will fund a variety of activities including professional development, subject area testing for teachers in core academic subjects, ESE endorsement activities, early career support activities, contracted services with vendors for professional development, and math/science content courses at the University of South Florida, St. Petersburg. Specific agreements with various providers of professional development will be approved as future agenda items. Additional activities include leadership training for principals and activities to support retention and recruitment of teachers and principals for high need schools. Federal legislation also requires funding in support of non-public school participation in Title II, Part A activities.
